He is short, two years from his teens. But he is walking ten feet tall.

Becoming the youngest graduate at eleven years and two months, Tathagat Avtar Tulsı has rewritten the Guinness Books of Records. Scoring 70%, he graduated with honours in physics from Patna University.

Tathagat's father Tulsı Narayan Prasad, claims his son smashed the record of Jay Luo of Garden City, USA, who graduated in Science from Boise University, Idaho, when he was twelve years one month and twelve days old.

Tathagat took the Part I, II & III examinations in the same year. But making him sit for the examination was a battle hard fought and won. Patna University was in a quandary, but the Patna High Court stepped in allowing him to take all three examinations in March last year.

University authorities however are guarded about letting him enroll for the M.Sc. course. "We planned his admission, but the University does not seem to agree." Tulsı Prasad said.

Records are not new for Tathagat. When he passed his CBSE at age nine and a half, he was said to have broken the record of Alexander Hill of England, who passed his school leaving examination when he was ten years and two months old.

Tathagat is in Delhi. "I am very happy and proud to be the youngest graduate," was all he said. "He is not the kind of boy to jump about in excitement." Tulsai Prasad said.

The boy from a modest home in Bhojpur District of Central Bihar claims to have authored a paper titled "Electrogravity unification and energy loss phenomenon." His father said efforts were on to find a British publisher for the paper.

It's not clear how a publisher can accept a work that is unrecognized in the scientific world. The practice is to first get a paper published in peer reviewed journals, like Physical Review Letters, Nature and Science.

After all, Tathagat claims to be working on a subject that has been engaging the minds of frontier physicist like Stephen Hawking, who wrote the best selling primer on the birth of the universe. A brief history of time.

"I want to solve the unsolved problems in physics," said Tathagat. Is that precocious pattern? Or could it just be talent taking? It shouldn't take too long to find out.
